

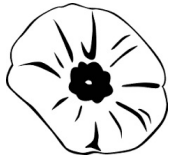

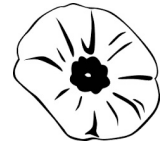


Finding God in All Things

NOVEMBER 11, 1918 - NOVEMBER 11, 2019



On November 11, 2019, 100 years will have passed since the signing of the Armistice that officially ended World War I. We can only imagine the sense of relief that must have been felt, perhaps a sense of joy and looking forward to the future with hope.

But for all those who were directly or indirectly affected by the destruction, nothing could erase the horror of war. War was not a goal to be pursued or an event to be glorified. We hear the staggering numbers of young men who lost their lives or were injured in the war.

Numbers can seem impersonal, but let's remember these men (and their families and friends) one by one.

Private Leo M. Shortall from the Royal Newfoundland Regiment wrote on May 2, 2017 -

“Well , here I am in London with six wounds and a broken leg.
Fritz got me pretty hard when he did get me.
I have one in my right hip, one in my right groin,
one in the right side of my stomach,
one in my left thigh and one in my left arm.
My right leg is broken close to the body.”

Shortall died one year and a fortnight after his injury and is buried in Surrey, England.
R.I.P.

This month we remember our war dead 'Lest We Forget' the cost of all war. All human conflicts are inevitable given our wounded and wounding human condition. Yet, all is not lost insofar as we awaken to and cooperate with God's holy grace at work in all aspects of our lived experience. Our gracious God is never a God of war. Further more, let us consider that war is not the absence of peace but, rather the presence of Christ Risen amidst all human circumstances. Storied Gospel memories like that of John 20:19-21 and elsewhere testify to this sublime reality. [...the disciples gathered in a locked room for fear of the Jewish authorities. Jesus came, stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ...as the Father sent me, I send you..."] Enlivened by Christ's presence we become channels of His peace. Who among us could request a more privileged holy life purpose?
